In terms of substantive focus, this series of lectures and readings explores the underlying causes and social consequences of the changing distribution of power, status and wealth in the PRC between 1978 and 2005. Although required background readings privilege scholarly work published in English, lectures and class discussion will draw on a wider range of sources and feature comparisons between different scholarly traditions. Therefore, a major goal of the seminar in terms of research training is for students to become adept at understanding how choice of target audience and scholarly conventions shape theoretical paradigms and the ability to maximize the fieldwork experience.
